

Language and Communication: The Heart of Deaf Culture


ASL is a complete, **visual language** with its own **grammar**, distinct from English.

Name signs are personal identifiers given within the Deaf community; <u>hearing</u> <u>people should NOT create them.</u>

Communication is **direct** and **honest**, seen as a norm rather than rudeness.

Visual engagement is crucial, including eye contact and clear visual cues to get attention.





Identity and Community: Embracing Deaf Culture

Deafness is an **identity**, <u>NOT</u> a disability. Many Deaf individuals see themselves as part of a **vibrant cultural group**.

Deaf pride means **embracing** identity rather than seeking a "cure" like cochlear implants.

The community is **close-knit**, with shared **experiences** and **traditions**, often centered around Deaf schools.

"Deaf Gain" highlights the **positive** contributions and **unique** perspectives of the Deaf community.

Marlee Matlin (b. 1965): An Academy Award-winning actress and advocate for Deaf rights, known for using her platform to promote ASL and Deaf culture.
